# Part 14 Mosher – Russell

#### JACOB MOSHER

Born 3 June 1772 <sup>1</sup> in Hollis, New Hampshire according to his gravestone or in Pepperell, Massachusetts, according to his death record. <sup>2</sup> He was the son of James and (Eunice (Blood) Mosher. He came to Whately in 1806 and died there of typhus on 28 Aug. 1855. Crafts wrote that the Mosher place, on present day Long Plain Road, was built in 1833. He married Mary Pierce of Rindge, New Hampshire. She was born in 1779 in New Hampshire and died of old age, in Holyoke, 15 Jan. 1870. <sup>3</sup> Jacob and Mary had seven children:

**Jacob**, b. in Hollis in 1798 and has his own entry.

**Mary**, b. 1800 and d. of typhoid fever, 21 March 1863, in Whately. <sup>4</sup> She m. Abel **NASH** of Whately.

**Solomon**, b. 1802 and has his own entry.

**Lucy**, b. 1805 and d. of pneumonia, 18 Jan. 1877. <sup>5</sup> She m. (1) Heman **SWIFT** (2) of Whately, who died of consumption in 1848. <sup>6</sup> She m. (2) Erastus **GRAVES** (57) of Whately in 1851. **Charles**, b. Jan. 1812 and d. 29 Jan. 1813. <sup>7</sup>

**Rufus**, b. 1814 and has his own entry.

**Clarissa**, born 1822 and d. of jaundice, 25 Feb. 1878. <sup>8</sup> She was called "Clara" in the death record. She m. Nelson **MUNSON** (16) of Whately.

### **JACOB MOSHER**

The son of Jacob and Eunice (Blood) Mosher, he was born in Hollis, New Hampshire in 1798 and died 15 Jan. 1890. <sup>9</sup> He married Arethusa Hills who died in 1886. <sup>10</sup> Crafts wrote that he married (2) Lucy Huntly, but it is Arethusa who appears with him in every census record and who is buried in the Osborn Cemetery in LaGrange, Indiana. Four of their five children lived and married elsewhere than Whately. Daughter Maria, born 5 Oct. 1846, died of pernicious anemia, 12 May 1908. <sup>11</sup> She married Edward **BELDEN** (56), the son of Stephen **BELDEN** (32) of Whately.

### **SOLOMON MOSHER**

The son of Jacob and Eunice (Blood) Mosher, he was born 11 Oct. 1802 and died of old age, in Hatfield, 8 Sept. 1892. <sup>12</sup> He married (1) Elvira, the daughter of Francis **BELDEN** (14) of Whately. She was born in 1802 according to her gravestone or 1807 according to Crafts. She died 28 Aug. 1830. <sup>13</sup> In 1831 he married (2) Lucy, daughter of Reuben and Hannah (Hibbard)

**BELDEN (15)** She was the first cousin of his first wife, born in 1814 and died 27 March 1875, the cause being listed as "unk". <sup>14</sup>

Children of Solomon and Elvira:

**Julia**, b. 1825 and d. 12 Sept. 1909 in New York City. <sup>15</sup> She m. William Churchill of Heath.

**Alstead**, b. 1827 and d. in 1898. <sup>16</sup> He did not marry.

**Charles**, b. 1829 and d. 20 Jan. 1910, in South Deerfield, of chronic interstitial nephritis. <sup>17</sup> He m. Mary Jones of Deerfield.

Children of Solomon and Lucy:

**Reuben**, b. 1833 and d. of Bright's Disease, 18 Oct. 1883, in Hatfield. <sup>18</sup> He m. Elizabeth Anderson of Hatfield.

**Francis**, b. 1839, and d. 29 April 1904, of cancer of the neck, in Hatfield. <sup>19</sup> He m. Jane Anderson of Hatfield who d. in Whately, age 73, of heart disease, 10 Feb 1915. <sup>20</sup> Jane and Elizabeth Anderson were sisters.

## **RUFUS MOSHER**

The son of Jacob and Eunice (Blood) Mosher, he was born at Whately 7 Nov. 1814 and died 28 July 1896. <sup>21</sup> He married (1) Eliza Ann, daughter of Lemuel **WAITE** (25) of Whately. She was born in 1816 and died of consumption, 30 Oct. 1868. <sup>22</sup> Rufus married (2) Harriet A.E. Folsom of Springfield. Harriet was born in 1833 and died of "cancer of rectum", 21 Feb. 1896 just months before the death of her husband. <sup>23</sup> Rufus made his will on 4 March 1896 by which time he was widowed. <sup>24</sup> He was clearly a man of property making thousands of dollars of bequests to nieces and nephews and leaving real estate in Springfield to his Folsom brothers-in-law. His death record was not found despite a line-by-line search in Springfield death records. The writing of his will in the year that both he and wife died suggests that he had a chronic illness and knew death was imminent.

Rufus and Eliza had one child, **Electa Elvira**, born in Whately in 1842 and died of lung fever, in Springfield, 14 Jan. 1847. <sup>25</sup> Rufus and Harriet had no children.

### **MOSES MUNSON 5**

The son of Reuben and Mary (Chittenden) Munson, he was born 22 Sept. 1744 in Wallingford, Connecticut and died of dropsy, in Whately on 13 July 1817. <sup>26</sup> <sup>27</sup> He was not enumerated in Whately in 1790 although he was there. His son, Moses Jr. was enumerated. He made a will that is not dated but names his several children and grandchildren. <sup>28</sup> He also named his third wife

Mary (Truesdale). <sup>29</sup> Moses was the first of the Munson family to come from Connecticut to Whately. He arrived in 1784, along with his brother Reuben and their families. He was a Revolutionary War solder and a participant in Shay's Rebellion. He married (1) Abigail Munson who was born in Connecticut 2 Sept. 1744 and died of a "bilious fever" in Whately on 11 Sept. 1796. The gravestone annotation says she was born in Whately, but this appears to be incorrect as there is a marriage record for Abigail and Moses in North Branford, Connecticut. He married (2) Lucy Morton of Hatfield. She was born at an unknown date and died 13 Feb. 1810. <sup>30</sup> Moses married (3) Mary Truesdale. Moses and Abigail had seven children, all born in Connecticut. Crafts provided birth dates, but most conflict with the birth and gravestone records.

**Moses**, b. 3 August 1767 in Farmington, Connecticut <sup>31</sup> and has his own entry (8) **Levina**, b. 14 March 1769 <sup>32</sup> and d. 9 March 1837. <sup>33</sup> She m. Bezaliel **SMITH** (18) of Whately. In addition to her gravestone in Whately, she has one in Conway. <sup>34</sup>

**Abigail**, b. 9 March 1771 <sup>35</sup> and d. 5 May 1845. <sup>36</sup> She m. Samuel Church of Hatfield.

**Anna**, b. 31 March 1773 <sup>37</sup> and d. 7 Aug. 1816. <sup>38</sup>She m. Rufus **SMITH** (**22**) of Whately. Rufus and Bezaliel Smith were cousins.

**Sarah**, b. 18 Sept. 1775  $^{39}$  and d. 10 May 1864.  $^{40}$  She m., as his second wife, Abner **NASH** (7) of Whately.

**Margaret**, b. 7 Sept. 1777 and d. in May 1832. <sup>41</sup> She m. Jesse Church. Jesse and Samuel Church were brothers. Called Margery on her gravestone.

**Joel**, b. 1781 and has his own entry (9)

## **REUBEN MUNSON 6**

The brother of Moses, he was born 20 Dec. 1746 in Connecticut. <sup>42</sup> He died in Whately 20 March 1837. They came together from Connecticut to Whately about 1784. He married Sybil, daughter of Azariah Smith of Connecticut. She was born on 18 Feb. 1750 and died 7 Sept. 1829. <sup>43</sup> Reuben and Sybil had twelve children. Six of them were born before the move and six of them in Whately.

**Salmon**, b. 1770 and has his own entry (11)

Lucy, b. 1772 and d. 15 Jan. 1840. 44 She m. Nathan WAITE (42) of Whately.

**Selah**, b. 1776 and died in 1861. 45

**Reuben**, b. 1778 and has his own entry (10)

Joel, b. 1780 and has his own entry (12)

**Benjamin**, b. in 1782 and has his own entry (13)

**Mary/Polly**, b. 1784 and d. 6 June 1845. <sup>46</sup> She m. (1) Martin Phinney of Hartford who b. in 1811. She m. (2), in 1819, as his second wife, Luman Andrews.

**Sybil**, bp. 11 June 1786. <sup>47</sup> No further records found but it can be presumed that she died before her name was given to a sister baptized in 1788.

**Sybil**, bp 7 March 1788 <sup>48</sup> and d. in 1840. <sup>49</sup>

**Diademia**, bp. 14 Feb. 1790 <sup>50</sup> and d. of old age, 28 Sept. 1879. <sup>51</sup> She m. Eliphalet Waite of Williamsburg.

**John**, b. 1792 and has his own entry (14)

Osee, b. 1793 and has his own entry (15)

### **MOSES MUNSON 8**

The son of Moses (5) and Abigail (**MUNSON**) Munson, he was born in Connecticut about 1762 and drowned in the Deerfield River in Greenfield, 10 Nov. 1821. <sup>52</sup> The cause of death is inscribed on his tombstone. Along with his father he was a participant in Shay's Rebellion. He married Phebe, possibly the daughter of Solomon **MUNSON** (11) of Whately. Moses and Phebe had nine children born in Whately, and two more, not recorded by Crafts, born in Greenfield. An exceptionally short-lived group of children. Of the eleven only two lived over fifty years.

**Zobedia**, b. 19 Nov. 1789 and d. 20 Sept. 1796. <sup>53</sup> Called "Bede" on her gravestone. Seven years old at time of death. No death record found.

**Laura**, b. 1791 and d. 5 Feb. 1815 in Greenfield. <sup>54</sup> 23 years old at time of death.

**Morris**, b. 2 Sept. 1795 and d. of dropsy, 8 Feb. 1808. <sup>55</sup> Twelve years old at time of death. The date on the grave annotation does not agree with the death record.

**Moses**, b. 1797 and d. 17 July 1843 in Greenfield. <sup>56</sup> He m. Rebecca Johnson of Vernon, Vermont. Forty-six years old at time of death.

Merrick, b. 1799 and d. about 8 months old.

**Merrick**, b. 1801 and d. in 1882 in Pittsburgh. <sup>57</sup> He m. (1) Jane Liggett who was b. at an unknown date and d. in 1846. <sup>58</sup> Before 1850 when they appeared together in the census, he m. (2) Maria Risher. She d. in 1900. <sup>59</sup>

**Solomon**, b. 14 April 1802 and d. 25 July 1818. <sup>60</sup> He was 16 years old at time of death. **Zobedia**, b. 1805 and d. of "childbed fever", 5 April 1843, in Sunderland. <sup>61</sup> She was 38 years old. She married Warren Montague of Hadley.

**George**, b. 1807 and d. 30 Dec. 1859 of consumption in Millville, Pennsylvania. <sup>62</sup> He is buried in Southmont, Pennsylvania. <sup>63</sup> He m. Emily Anderson who was born in Deerfield in 1811.

**Harriet**, b. 1811 and d. 14 June 1811, aged 4 months, 14 days. <sup>64</sup> **Morris**, b. 1812 and d. 2 June 1813, aged 8 months.

### **JOEL MUNSON 9**

The son of Moses (5) and Abigail (**MUNSON**) Munson, he was born in Connecticut in 1781 and died in Peterborough, New Hampshire on 20 April 1864. <sup>65</sup> He married Mary/Polly, daughter of Elihu **WAITE** (17). She was born in Whately in 1783 and died in Peterborough on 1 Nov. 1867. <sup>66</sup> Crafts suggested that Joel had removed to LeRoy, New York but if so, it was temporary. Two of his sons did go to that location. Joel and Polly had twelve children born in Whately. For the last four details were found in other records.

**Erastus**, b. 14 Dec. 1800 and d. 4 July 1868. "He broke his neck by falling some 15 feet through a hole in a sawmill floor". <sup>67</sup> He m. Almira/Mira/Myra, daughter of Noah **BARDWELL** (27) of Whately. He was living in LeRoy, New York at the time of his death.

**Alvin**, b. 1802 and d. 13 Nov. 1878. <sup>68</sup> He d. of old age in Worcester. <sup>69</sup> He m. Annis, daughter of Orange **BARDWELL (24)** of Whately.

**Almon**, b. 1804 and d. in 1855 in LaGrange, Michigan. <sup>70</sup> He is supposed to have m. Mary Little but his wife in 1850 was Eliza Martin who was born in New York State about 1818 and died at an unknown date.

**Lucretia**, b. 1806 and d. of apoplexy, 2 Nov. 1874, in Peterborough, New Hampshire. <sup>71</sup> She m. Thomas Little, who was born in Waldo County, Maine.

**Sophronia**, b. 1808 and d. 14 Aug. 1880. <sup>72</sup> She m. Winthrop Graves of Sunderland. Her gravestone says "Sophia".

**Morris**, b. 1811 and d. 6 Nov. 1883. <sup>73</sup> He m. Sylvia Maria Joslyn of Verona, New York. **Clarissa**, b. in 1814 and d. of typhoid fever, 30 March 1869, in Sunderland. <sup>74</sup> She is buried in Conway. <sup>75</sup> She m. Jeremiah Flagg of Conway.

**Althana**, b. 1817 and d. 13 Feb. 1887 of pulmonary congestion, in Leominster. <sup>76</sup> She m. Harvey Look of Conway.

Mary, b. 1818 and d. 1849. No supporting records found.

**Harriet**, b. 15 Sept. 1820 and d. of paralysis, 6 Feb. 1899, in Gardner.<sup>77</sup> She m. Rev. Albert Heald of Nelson, New Hampshire.

**Susanna**, b. 25 Jan. 1823. She m. Edwin Sumner Fisher but no supporting records found. **Henry**, b. 20 Aug. 1825 and is supposed to have died in 1907. He m. Achsah Stevens who was born about 1823 in New York.

### **REUBEN MUNSON 10**

The son of Reuben (6) and Sybil (**SMITH**) Munson, he was born in Connecticut 19 Feb. 1778 and died 6 April 1842. <sup>78</sup> He married (1) Mary, daughter of John **SMITH** (no#) of Whately. Mary was born in Whately in 1781 and died at an unknown date but after 1805 when her third child was supposed to have been born. Reuben married (2) Electa Smith Hamilton, a younger sister of his first wife and widow of Benjamin Hamilton. Reuben and Mary had three children, details for two of whom were given by Crafts and not found elsewhere.

**Demis**, b. 29 Sept. 1801 and d. 11 Jan. 1802.

Demis, b 13 Jan. 1802. No supporting records found.

**Lorinda,** b. in 1805 and d. 31 May 1834 in Williamsburg. <sup>79</sup> She m. Thaddeus Bartlett of Williamsburg.

## SALMON/SOLOMON MUNSON 11

The son of Reuben (6) and Sybil (**SMITH**) Munson, he was born in Connecticut 24 Sept. 1770 and died 11 Dec. 1842, in New York State. <sup>80</sup> He married Ruth Day of Williamsburg. There are nine children listed in his Find a Grave annotation but no evidence that they were born in Whately. The family is associated largely with Buckland.

### **JOEL MUNSON 12**

The son of Reuben (6) and Sybil (**SMITH**) Munson, he was born in Connecticut 28 Feb. 1780 and died 14 April 1847. <sup>81</sup> He died intestate but his probate record includes an inventory. <sup>82</sup> He married (1) Patty Mott. She died in 1815 and he married (2) Julia Hayes. She died in 1820 and he married (3) Aminda, daughter of Lieut. Noah **BARDWELL** (13) of Whately. She was born in

### **JOHN MUNSON 14**

The son of Reuben (6) and Sybil (**SMITH**) Munson, he was born in Whately 3 Jan. 1792 and died of fever, 28 March 1858. <sup>94</sup> He married (1) Euphemia, daughter of Rufus **SMITH** (**22**) of Whately. She died of consumption in 1854. <sup>95</sup> John made his will on 5 March 1856 naming no wife and leaving his estate to his children. <sup>96</sup> He must have remarried, however, as there is a letter in his probate records from Judith D. Monson, his widow, requesting that his property be

### **OSEE MUNSON 15**

The son of Reuben (6) and Sybil (**SMITH**) Munson, he was born in Whately 3 Oct. 1793 and died in 1866. He wrote his will on 30 July 1863. There is no death or gravestone record but he made a will that was probated in 1866. <sup>103</sup> He married (1) Lurilla Smith of Ashfield in 1819. She died in 1835. <sup>104</sup> In 1836 he married (2) Mary Wade of Braintree. Mary died after 1870 when she was 72 years old and living with her stepson, Myron Munson. Osee was a determined abolitionist and credited with helping escaped slaves. He had nine children, eight with his first wife.

The son of Joel (12) and Patty (Mott) Munson, he was born at Whately 16 Sept. 1814 and died 12 Feb. 1848. <sup>113</sup> He married Clarissa, daughter of Jacob **MOSHER** of Whately. She was born in 1822 and died 25 Feb. 1878. <sup>114</sup> Clarissa and Nelson had only one child; **Champion**, born 1845. Champion was three when his father died. His mother was named as his guardian. <sup>115</sup> Champion married Stella Immel and lived in Paloma, Washington.

## **COTTON MUNSON 17**

The son of Joel (12) and Patty (Mott) Munson, he was born at Whately 16 March 1826 and died 26 or 27 March 1865. <sup>116</sup> <sup>117</sup> The date on the stone is 16 days different than that cited by Crafts. He married Martha Damon of Chesterfield. She was born 25 April 1930 and about 1870 married (2) Samuel **WILLS** of Whately. Cotton and Martha had three children:

**Jennie**, b. 1854 and d. of consumption, 11 May 1880.<sup>118</sup> She was 26 years old and is buried in West Whately. She married William **COOLEY (10)** of Whately.

Unnamed female infant b. 6 March 1859. d. soon.

**Ellen/Helen** b. 1865 and was with her mother and stepfather in 1880. She d. at an unknown date. In 1883 she m. Henry Ellsworth Nash who died of a compound fracture and tetanus, clearly an accident, in 1896. She was only 31 when widowed but there is no record of a second marriage. She died 9 January 1924 in Saskatchewan, Canada. <sup>119</sup>.

Minerva died of apoplexy on 28 Feb. 1887. <sup>122</sup> They were both daughters of David Scott of Williamsburg.

**Flora**, b. 4 Sept. 1884 and d. 25 March 1917. <sup>129</sup> She m. Charles Crotty of Springfield. **Homer George**, born 22 Feb. 1877 in Whately and d. 29 Sept. 1931. <sup>130</sup> By 1880 the family was in Lake Addie, Mnnnesota. On 27 June 1900 Homer m. Ruth Baker of Tolland who was 16 years old in that year when they were enumerated together living with his parents. In 1909 he was admitted to the disabled veterans home in Johnson City, Tennessee. The diagnosis was pulmonary tuberculosis, rheumatism and malaria. <sup>131</sup> In the same year he was transferred to TOGUS in Maine. He was readmitted to TOGUS in 1910, 1914, 1915, 1921 and 1929. <sup>132</sup>By 1910 Homer and Ruth were divorced. Homer was living with his parents in Springfield. His second wife was Helen (mnu) and she died sometime before he was enumerated as widowed in 1930. He spent time at TOGUS in Maine as a disabled veteran. His diagnosis was

### LYMAN A. MUNSON 25

The son of Erastus Smith Munson (18) and Minerva (**SCOTT**) Munson, he was born in Whately 4 Oct. 1850 and died on 16 Dec. 1924. <sup>133</sup> He married Rosabel Perthenia Brooker of Gill. She was the daughter of John and Rachel (Gains) Brooker and the sister of Ellen Sanderson, wife of Asa **SANDERSON** (37) and of Lucy Bardwell, wife of Cotton **BARDWELL** (65). On her gravestone she is called "Fanny P." She is thus named in her death record as well. She died 19 May 1906 in the Dickinson Hospital in Northampton, the cause being "collapse from intestinal obstruction". <sup>134</sup> They had one child, **Maud Estelle**, born in 1877. Maud married Elmer Hill and died after 1940 when she was living with her husband in Northampton.

### **HERBERT SMITH MUNSON 26**

The son of Erastus Smith Munson (18) and Minerva (**SCOTT**) Munson, he was born at Whately 10 October 1862 and died 19 Feb. 1937. <sup>135</sup> He married Nettie Louise (Winch) of Williamsburg. They had no children.

### REV. CALVIN MONROE/MUNROE

A Universalist minister who later denounced Universalism and became a Baptist, Calvin was the son of Abijah Monroe of Surrey, New Hampshire. He was born 13 Dec. 1793 and died 16 Oct. 1879 in Belfast, Maine. <sup>136</sup> He married Vesta, daughter of Seth **BELDEN** (**16**) of Whately. She was born in 1814 in Whately and died of old age, 26 Jan. 1899, in Belfast. <sup>137</sup> Their several children were probably born in Conway where the family was living in 1850 although the marriage record for Lucelia notes that she was born in "East Wheatley." Only Calvin and Lucy, born in 1847, have birth records in Conway. By 1860 the family was in Belfast, Maine where Calvin's brother, Hollis and Nahum resided.

**Harriet**, b. about 1832 and died at an unknown date. She was enumerated as 18 years old in 1850 and 22 years old in 1860 but not found thereafter.

**Mary E**. b, 6 Dec. 1838 in Hatfield and is supposed to have died in 1881. She m. John George Cook and resided in Georgetown, Washington D.C.

Lucelia, b. 7 May 1842 and d. 6 Dec. 1912. 138 She m. John Warren Ferguson.

**Augusta**, b. her twin, b. 7 May 1842 and d. 9 Aug. 1868 in Belfast. Text only record, mo cause of death recorded. She was 25 years old and not married.

**Maria**, b. 1 April 1845 in Williamsburg and d. 26 Nov. 1884 in Wrentham. She m. Edson George.

**Calvin**, b. 19 Dec. 1847 and d. in 1921. <sup>139</sup> He m. Cora Etta Murray.

**Lucy Elizabeth**, his twin, b. 19 Dc. 1847 and d. 25 Nov. 1938 in Santa Paula, California. She m. Josiah Keene. An article written at the time of her death was titled *Beloved Pioneer Woman Answers Summons to the Great Beyond*. <sup>140</sup>She went to Washington D.C. to live with her married sister and was there at the time of Lincoln's assassination. She attended the inauguration of U.S. Grant.

**William Henry**, b. 25 Aug.1849 and d. of croup, in Conway, 22 Sept. 1851.  $^{141}$  In the 1850 census he was enumerated as Henry W.

#### **JOSEPH NASH 6**

The son of Jonathan (5) and Mary (**HAWLEY**) Nash, he was born at Amherst 5 April 1747 and died 15 May 1804 in Whately. <sup>142</sup> Cause of death was noted but is illegible. Joseph married Lucy, daughter of Eleazer **ALLIS** (10) of Whately. She was born in 1750 and is supposed to have died in 1795 in Shelburne, New York. Joseph and Lucy had seven children:

Mary, b. 1779 and d. at an unknown date. In 1800 she m. Calvin SAXTON of Whately.

The son of Jonathan (5) and Mary (**HAWLEY**) Nash, he was baptized 10 April 1757 and came to Whately about 1787. He was a participant in Shay's Rebellion and was enumerated in Whately in 1790. He died in 1837 in Earlville, New York. <sup>147</sup> He married (1) Hannah, daughter of Abner **DICKINSON** (13) of Whately. She died 1814 in Earlville. <sup>148</sup> He married (2) Sarah, daughter of Moses **MUNSON** (5) of Whately. Three children were born in Whately and baptized in Jan, in 1794. Horace, their son, was born in New York in November of that same year. Abner and

### **CHARLES NASH**

The son of Abel and Mary (**MOSHER**) Nash, he was born in Whately 22 April 1821 and died 15 Dec. 1897. <sup>167</sup> He married Julia, daughter of Joseph **BROWN** of Whately. She was born 27 Aug. 1823 and died of consumption, 17 Oct. 1884. <sup>168</sup> Both are buried in East Whately. Charles and Julia had two children:

**Miriam Sophia**, b. 22 June 1856 and d. d. 12 May 1911 of diabetes. <sup>169</sup> She was born the daughter of Stephen **BELDEN** (**32**) of Whately, but her mother died a month after her birth and she was subsequently adopted by her aunt and uncle, Charles and Julia (**BROWN**) **NASH**. This led to confusion because Crafts had Miriam Sophia Belden and Miriam Sophia Nash born on the same day and both marrying Walter F. Cooley. There are marriage records in both names. The death record is in the name of Miriam S. Belden Cooley, but the gravestone is in the name of Miriam Sophia Nash Cooley. <sup>170</sup>

Elihu Cook, b. 3 April 1862 and d. of consumption, 16 Nov. 1883. 171

#### **JAMES NASH**

The son of Abel and Mary (**MOSHER**) Nash, he was born in Whately 26 July 1831 and died in Bridgeport, Connecticut, 30 Dec. 1897. <sup>172</sup> He married Almira Wood of New Salem. She was born about 1835 and died 2 May 1895. <sup>173</sup> James and Almira had one child born in Whately. That child was **Ernest Winthrop** Nash, born in 1857 and died after 1920 when he was living in Milford, Connecticut. He married Harriet Wright of Danbury, Connecticut.

### **ERNEST WINTHROP NASH**

The son of James and Almira (Woods) Nash, he was born at Whately on 6 Jan. 1857 and d. 13 April 1929. <sup>174</sup> Though his mother he was supposed to be a descendant of George Soule, Mayflower passenger. He married Harriet Wright of Danbury, Connecticut and resided in Bridgeport.

### **THOMAS NASH**

The son of Thomas and Naomi (Warner) Nash, he was born 23 Nov. 1812 in Williamsburg and died of "general debility" on 7 Oct. 1891 also in Williamsburg. <sup>175</sup> He married Lucinda King who was born in Chesterfield in 1815 and died of heart failure, in Williamsburg, 1 Feb. 1900. <sup>176</sup> Although Crafts thought Thomas resided in Whately for some time, all the census enumerations from 1850 to 1880 show the family in Williamsburg.

# **ALANSON NASH**

The son of Oliver and Julia (Strong) Nash, he was born on 5 Aug. 1849 in Williamsburg and died 17 Oct. 1932, also in Williamsburg. <sup>177</sup> He married Ellen "Nellie" Baker of Chesterfield. He never lived in Whately but two of his daughters married Whately Dickinson brothers and his son's house was moved to Whately. Alanson and Ellen had three children:

**Emma**, b. 24 May 1882 and d. 12 Nov. 1962. <sup>178</sup> She m. William Leroy **DICKINSON** (**64**) of Whately.

**Anna**, b. 28 July 1889 and d. 29 October 1966. <sup>179</sup> She m. George Raymond **DICKINSON** (65) of Whately.

**Stanley**, b. 28 July 1891 and d. 11 July 1984. <sup>180</sup> His house on Adams Road was moved to Webber Road in Whately.

#### JAMES NOLAN

The son of James and Bridget (mnu) Nolan, he was born about 1833 in Ireland and died 15 June 1910 of an "intestinal obstruction", in Whately. <sup>181</sup> He made his will four days before he died, leaving land to his daughters. To his grandson, James Collins, he left "*my mare and colt*". <sup>182</sup> He lived in West Whately in a house long gone but "Jimmy Nolan Road" and Jimmy Nolan Brook" are lasting testaments to his time in Whately. He came to Whately with a wife named Margaret who died of "sunstroke", 31 July 1877. <sup>183</sup> Her parents were listed as Phillip and Catherine Flavin of Ireland and she may have been related to Michael Flavin who also came from Ireland and settled in Whately. In 1871 James Nolam was on a list of Whately residents who kept a dog. James married (2) Bridget Ellsworth who died of pneumonia, 9 Feb. 1909. <sup>184</sup> Both his children were with Margaret.

**Mary**, b. July 1857 and d. in 1919 <sup>185</sup> when she was living in South Deerfield with her husband. She m. Michael **COLLINS** of Whately and South Deerfield.

**Katie**, b. 1859 and d. 20 May 1927 in Hinsdale, New Hampshire. <sup>186</sup> She m. James McCormick of Conway.

### **MORRIS NOLAN**

The son of James and Bridget (mnu) Nolan, he was probably a brother of James Nolan although no record has formally supported this conjecture. He was born in Ireland in Sept. 1841 and died in 1929. <sup>187</sup> He was married to Katherine Keresy, also born in Ireland about 1846 and died 4 Dec. 1915. <sup>188</sup> Newspaper clippings posted on the internet tell that she dropped dead upon entering her home after visiting friends. Morris and Katherine had five children:

**James**, b. about 1869 and d. in 1936 in Springfield. <sup>189</sup> He m. Kate Hartnett. **Morris**, b. about 1870 and d. 25 Dec. 1933. <sup>190</sup> He m. Hannah Hennessey. **Michael**, b. about 1873 and d. of scarlet fever, in Northampton, 16 Feb. 1875. <sup>191</sup> **Mary**, b. about 1874 and d. 1930. <sup>192</sup> She did not marry.

**John**, b. about 1876 and d. 1948. <sup>193</sup> He m. Julia Shea.

### **STEPHEN ORCUTT 4**

The son of Ichabod (3) and Mary (Burrell) Orcutt, he was born at Weymouth in 1755 and is supposed to have died in 1821 in Pittsford, Vermont. Crafts wrote that he was accidentally killed while erecting a bridge. No Vermont death record was found and no grave record in Pittsford. He married Theodora, daughter of Benjamin **SCOTT** (6) of Whately. She was born about 1747 and died at an unknown date. Theodora was a noted "spinster" of wool, linen and tow. Temple's history of Whately includes a complete list of her output for 1781. <sup>194</sup> Stephen and Theodora had two children:

**Stephen**, b. about 1777 and has his own entry (5) **Zebina** b. 1779 but no supporting records found.

#### STEPHEN ORCUTT

The son of Stephen (4) and Theodora (**SCOTT**) Orcutt, he was born about 1777 and died of delirium tremens, in Conway, 14 April 1844. <sup>195</sup> This was not long after his wife died of consumption, 20 Feb. 1844. <sup>196</sup> Both are buried in the Howland Cemetery in Conway. Stephen is supposed to have built the house at 1 Chestnut Plain, just on the border of Whately and Hatfield. <sup>197</sup> The site is just below a significant fall in the waters of West Brook and extensive mill foundations can be seen behind the property, including a pottery operated by Orcutt. He married Miriam, daughter of Eleazer **FRARY** (10) of Whately. They had six children:

**Eleazer**, b. 1796 and d. in 1864. <sup>198</sup> He m. Jane Giles of Troy, New York and resided there. He was a potter who moved to Troy where he continued in the stoneware business. He has an entry in the U.S. Craftsperson Files. <sup>199</sup>

Walter, b. 1799 and has his own entry (7)

**Phila**, b. about 1802 and d. 18 Sept. 1834. <sup>200</sup> She did not marry.

**Triphena**, b. about 1807 and d. in New York City, Aug. 1895. <sup>201</sup> She m. Lucius B. Nutting of Salem.

**Hannah,** b. about 1812 and d. 1895. <sup>202</sup> She m. Lemuel Smith Barlow who was born in New York or New Hampshire, depending upon your choice of census record.

Lucinda, b. about 1818 and d. in 17 April 1894 in Kennebunk, Maine. <sup>203</sup> She m. Horace Burke.

### **WALTER ORCUTT 7**

The son of Stephen (5) and Miriam (FRARY) Orcutt, he was born in Whately 7 May 1799 and died of consumption, 1 March 1854 in New York City. <sup>204</sup> He is buried in the Howland Cemetery in Conway. <sup>205</sup> He married Ann Eliza Blatchford who was born in Troy and resided in Whately,

Conway and New York. Ann Eliza married (2) Nathan Warner of Conway. Walter and Ann Eliza had three children:

**Miriam**, b. in New York and d. after 1870 when she was living in Whately with her husband, William Baker of Conway.

Eleazer, b. 1825 and has his own entry (8)

**Catherine**, b. about 1826 and d. after 1880 when she was widowed and living in Hartford, Connecticut. She m. Alvin Warner of Hatfield.

## **ELEAZER FRARY ORCUTT 8**

The son of Walter (7) and Ann Eliza (Blatchford) Orcutt, he was born 1 Nov. 1825 and died of "uremic convulsions", at Whately, 25 Oct. 1889. <sup>206</sup> He married Lydia Ann Graves who was born in Deerfield, Ashfield or Conway, depending on what record you choose. Her death record says Deerfield. She was born 7 Dec. 1830 and died 31 May 1906, in Whately, of "bulbar paralysis". <sup>207</sup> Usually called bulbar palsy, this is a rare disease involving dysfunction of the cranial nerves. Lydia made her will on 5 Sept. 1902 leaving \$5.00 to her granddaughter Hortense and everything else to her daughters, Anna Howes and Ella Elder. <sup>208</sup> Eleazer and Lydia had four children:

**William Baker**, b. 1852 and d. of pneumonia, in Northampton, 24 March 1897. <sup>209</sup> He m. Mary Elizabeth, the adopted daughter of Otis Kingsley of Williamsburg. Their daughter, **Hortense** was b. 2 Oct. 1874 and d. 21 Jan. 1936. <sup>210</sup> She did not marry.

Walter Eleazer, bb. in 1855 and has his own entry.

Anna Eliza, bb. 1865 and d. in 1932 in Northampton. <sup>211</sup> She m. Ryland **HOWES** of Whately. They apparently divorced because in 1910 he was single and living with his father and in that year Anna m. (2) Clarence Irving, the son of Irving **ALLIS** (35) of Whately, a man 15 years her junior. In 1911, in Hatfield, Ryland m. (2) Mary, daughter of Francis Mosher of Hatfield. **Ella Louis**, bb. 1871 and d. 28 June 1941. <sup>212</sup> She m. George **ELDER** (6) of Whately

### WALTER ELEAZER ORCUTT 10

**The** son of Eleazer (8) and Lydia Ann (Graves) Orcutt, was born 19 April 1855 and died of in New York City, 26 June 1894. <sup>213</sup> He married Lizzie Ellen, daughter of William Hubbard of South Deerfield. She was born in 1860 and died in 1936. <sup>214</sup>



### **ABRAHAM PARKER 4**

The son of Isaac (3) and Ruth (**BLOOD**) Parker he was born in 24 Sept. 1726 in Groton. <sup>215</sup> He married Lois Blood of Groton and came with her to Whately. He operated a ferry across the Connecticut River and was drowned, 12 March 1757, aged 31 years. <sup>216</sup> He was a Revolutionary War soldier. Lois, daughter of James Blood of Groton, was born in 1727 in Groton and died 27 Sept. 1814 of dropsy, in Whately. <sup>217</sup> Abraham very early built a house in Whately, just south of the Deerfield line. The house, so completely renovated that it is not recognizable, retains enough of the original construction to be called the oldest house in Whately. <sup>218</sup> Abraham left five children, one of them posthumous.

**Lois**, b. 8 July 1750 and d. at an unknown date but after 1791 when she had her last child. She is buried in the Center Cemetery in Whately but there is no death date on the stone. <sup>219</sup> She married John **GRAVES (43)** of Whately.

**Abraham**, b. at Whately in 1752 and d. 10 Oct. 1837 in Hawley. <sup>220</sup> He m. Abigail Ingram of Amherst and resided in Hawley.

**Susanna**, b. 1754 and d. of old age, 15 Aug. 1845, in Hatfield. <sup>221</sup> She m. Ebenezer **SCOTT** (16) of Whately.

**Eunice**, b. 1756 and d. in 1841 in Brattleboro, Vermont. <sup>222</sup> She m. Jonathan Goodnough of Holden.

Benjamin, b. 11 Oct. 1757 and has his own entry (6)

### **BENJAMIN PARKER 6**

The son of Abraham (4) and Lois (**BLOOD**) Parker, he was born in Whately on 11 Oct. 1757 and died 21 Feb. 1811. <sup>223</sup> He was a Revolutionary War soldier. He married Hannah Guild of Hatfield who was born in 1762 and died 29 March 1857 in Whately. <sup>224</sup> In 1850 Hannah was living in Whately with her unmarred daughter Nancy. By 1855 Nancy had married Martin Woods and the couple were living with Hannah. Benjamin and Hannah had twelve children:

**Asa**, b. 12 March 1783 and d. of dysentery, 11 Aug. 1787. <sup>225</sup>

**Eunice**, b. 1785 and d. after 1860 when she was living with her husband in Bleecker, New York. She m. Joseph Eastman

Asa, b. 1787 and has his own entry (7)

**Nancy**, b. 1788 and d. in South Deerfield, of dysentery, 19 Sept. 1871. <sup>226</sup> She m. Benjamin Munn in 1819. He d. in 1852 and in 1853 she m. (2) Martin **WOODS** (6) of Whately.

**Isaac**, b. 1790 and d. of old age, 2 Sept. 1889. <sup>227</sup> He m. Diadama Russell and lived in South Deerfield.

Anna, b.11 March 1791 and d. of dysentery, in Whately, 10 Nov. 1802. <sup>228</sup>

Levi, b. 16 Jan. 1783 and d. 16 April 1794. 229

**Levi**, b. 26 April 1795 and d. 24 April 1796. <sup>230</sup>

**Electa**, b. 29 Dec. 1797 and d. of dysentery, 24 Sept. 1845. <sup>231</sup>

**Experience**, born 1799 and died of pneumonia, 1 March 1878, in Lanesborough. <sup>232</sup> She m. Enoch Nourse of Ashley.

**Caroline**, b. 1801 and d. of old age, 2 Nov. 1880, in Goshen. <sup>233</sup> She m. Holland Hubbard of Keene, New Hampshire.

**Anna**, b. 1803 and d. 16 Dec. 1893 in Summit County, Ohio. <sup>234</sup> She m. (1) Decalvia (not Decalous) Moore of Putney, Vermont. He died in 1859 in Cuyahoga, Ohio and in 1864 she m. (2) Erastus Congdon. She is buried in the Oakwood Cemetery in Cuyahoga Falls.

### CAPTAIN ASA PARKER 7

The son of Benjamin (6) and Hannah (Guild) Parker, he was born 5 March 1787 and died of dropsy, in Whately, 29 May 1871. <sup>235</sup> He married (1) Hannah Cooley who was born about 1790 (age 32 on gravestone) and died 11 April 1822. <sup>236</sup> He married (2) Hannah Clapp who was born in 1796 and died of pneumonia, 7 March 1874. <sup>237</sup> Asa wrote his will on 23 Feb. 1867. To Hannah he left *the use, income and improvement of one third of all my real estate during her natural life and to have one third part of my dwelling house, where she pleases. Also all household furniture, beds, bedding and household utensils of every name and description whatever and also one cow...* To his son Levi he left \$5.00 having given him in my life time all

*I intended him to have.* To his son Edwin he left \$2000. His three sons, Asa, Martin and Edwin were to share equally in the residue. <sup>238</sup> With Asa and Hannah un 1850 was her sister Sarah Clapp, age 60. Sarah died of consumption on 30 May 1859. <sup>239</sup> Both Hannah and Sarah are buried in East Whately.

Children of Asa and Hannah Cooley:

Levi, b. 1817 and has his own entry (9)

**Emerson**, b. 1819 and d. in 7 Aug. 1846. <sup>240</sup> Crafts wrote that he d. in 1840 in Virginia but the gravestone in East Whately has the 1846 date and nothing was found to support the Virginia death. No wife found.

**Asa**, b. 1821 and d. of "la grippe", 18 Jan. 1901, in Westfield. <sup>241</sup> He m. Julia Cooley and resided in Westfield.

Children of Asa and Hannah Clapp:

Edwin C. b. 1826 and has his own entry (11)

**Martin C.** b. 1828 and d. 14 March 1900 of "fatty degeneration of the heart", in Northampton. <sup>242</sup> He m. (1) Almira Jones of Deerfield and after her death he married (2) Mary daughter of Noah **FRARY (25)** of Whately. He resided in Northampton and had no children.

**Orlando**, b. 15 Oct. 1830 and d. 18 July 1853. <sup>243</sup> No death record found. Crafts wrote that Orlando died in 1843, probably a typo.

**Hannah**, b. 16 Oct. 1833 and d. of "disease of the heart" 12 Aug. 1853. <sup>244</sup>.

### **EDWIN C. PARKER 11**

The son of Asa (7) and Hannah (**COOLEY**) Parker, he was born at Whately on 17 Oct. 1826 and died 5 Dec. 1917. <sup>245</sup>. He married Hannah Kinnecut of New York who was born in Dec. 1829 and died in 1924 in Agawam where she was living with her son Edwin. Edwin was single and living with his parents in 1860 and married but still with his parents in 1870. In 1871 he was included on a list of Whately residents who had a dog. By 1880 he had moved to Amherst. Edwin and Hannah had two sons, neither of whom had Whately connections.

### LORENZO PAYNE

The son of Zebulon and Elizabeth (Harris) Payne, he was born 2 Oct. 1844 in Heath. He married, as her second husband, Luanna, daughter of Jerre **GRAVES** (67) on 15 June 1862 in Halifax, Vermont. <sup>246</sup> On 8 Sept. 1862 he enlisted in Company D. Massachusetts 52<sup>nd</sup> Volunteer Infantry. <sup>247</sup> He died at Baton Rouge, Louisiana on 20 January 1863. <sup>248</sup> They had a posthumous child, born 2 May 1863 in Whately, Willie Lorenzo Payne. A notice published in 1874 states *from and after Dec. 1873 there be allowed and paid to Louanna Payne, mother of Willie L. Payne, for his benefit, the whole amount of state aid which he would have received had he been born during the life of his father Lorenzo Z. Payne. <sup>249</sup> Luanna was first married to Berea Willsey of*



Troy, New York and whether she was divorced at the time of her marriage to Payne is questionable. Berea Willsey kept a Civil War diary that is readily available today.



#### SOLOMON PEASE

He was neither born nor died in Whately, but he built a house "in the Straits" before moving to Heath. His son Roswell married Dolly Allis, who is supposed to be of Whately but no record of her parents was found. Nor were records found for Solomon's children who were mentioned by Crafts.

### **JABEZ PEASE**

The son of James and Lucy (Meachem) Pease, he was born 30 March 1783. He came to Whately from Cayuga County, New York about 1841. They lived on Long Plain Road (originally Straits Road). <sup>250</sup> He died of "affliction of the kidneys", in Deerfield, 8 Jan. 1859. <sup>251</sup> He and his wife are buried in East Whately. <sup>252</sup> Jabez married Sybil Sanderson of Dalton. She was born in 1788 and died of paralysis, in Whately, 30 Sept. 1869. <sup>253</sup> Jabez and Sybil had seven children:

**Eliza Ann**, b. 31 Dec 1811 (Grave annotation says 1 Jan. 1812) and d 12 Sept. 1906. <sup>254</sup>. She m. Dr. Andrew D. Wood.

**John**, b. in 1814 and d. 29 May 1816 in Geneva, New York. <sup>255</sup>

**Sarah**, b. 13 Oct. 1817 and d. 22 Dec. 1822 in Auburn, New York. <sup>256</sup>

**Robert**, b. 6 June 1820 and d. in 1901. <sup>257</sup> He m. Elizabeth Schermerhorn.

**George**, b. 18 Aug. 1823 and d. 14 April 1898 in San Francisco. <sup>258</sup>

**Helen**, b. 3 Nov. 1827 and d. after 1920 when she was 92 years old and living in Worcester with her daughter, Marion Waite. She married George W. **REED** of Whately. Although only 20 years

old at the time of her marriage, she had a considerable personal estate of furniture and household goods. Her Pease grandparents died in 1844 and 1846 and it is possible that she inherited from them. Unusually, on 2 Nov. 1847, the day before her wedding, she and George signed a prenuptial agreement that her personal estate would remain "*free from the control and interference of her husband.*" <sup>259</sup> The document includes an inventory.

Charles, b. 3 May 1835 and d. of consumption, in Whately, 18 April 1848. <sup>260</sup>

#### **HOSEA PEASE 7**

The son of Sharon and Mary/Polly (Brooks) Pease, he was born in 1800 in Enfield, Connecticut. He died of consumption, in Whately on 24 Sept. 1871. <sup>261</sup> He married Susan Sherbrooke and came to Whately after a time of residence in Belfast, Maine where three of his children were born. Susan was born in 1809 in Belchertown and died 24 March 1866. <sup>262</sup> Hosea and Susan had six children:

**George**, b. Aug. 1833. he was in Whately with his parents in 1850 but not found thereafter. **Henry**, b. 1835 and has his own entry (8)

**Susan**, b. 2 Feb. 1837 and d. of nephritis, 28 June 1901, in Northampton. <sup>263</sup> She m. Luther Clark of Northampton.

**Charles F.** b. 1838 and has his own entry (9)

**John Fleming**. b. 15 June 1841 in Maine and d. 10 March 1901 in East Hartford, Connecticut. <sup>264</sup> He enlisted in Company F., 37<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Infantry. <sup>265</sup> He m. Celestia Witter of Canterbury, Connecticut.

Freeman, b. in Whately in 1843 and d. of diarrhea, 29 Oct. 1854. <sup>266</sup>

**James H**. b. 25 Feb. 1848 and died in 1888 in Springfield. He m. Sarah Ann Stevenson of South Hadley.

## **HENRY PEASE 8**

The son of Hosea (7) and Susan (Sherbrook) Pease, he was born 16 Sept. 1834 in Belfast, Maine and died, a suicide, 18 Jan. 1903 in Northampton. <sup>267</sup> He married, as her second husband, Louisa Rockwell, *nee* Smith of Sunderland. She was born in 1836 and died 27 Feb 1918. <sup>268</sup>

Child of Henry and Louisa:

**Charles Henry**, born 1867 and has his own entry (10)

#### **CHARLES F. PEASE 9**

The son of Hosea (7) and Susan (Sherbrook) Pease, he was born 14 Jan. 1839 in Belfast, Maine <sup>269</sup> and died in a railroad accident, 27 Aug. 1894. <sup>270</sup> He died intestate but there is a probate record that names his widow and four adult children. <sup>271</sup>He married Julia M. Porter. She was born

**George Frederick,** b. in 1869 and has his own entry (12)

### **CHARLES HENRY PEASE 10**

The son of Henry (8) and Louisa (Smith) (Rockwell) Pease, he was born in Whately 2 Nov. 1867 and died in 1940. <sup>275</sup> He married Flora, the daughter of George **DICKINSON** (**54**) of Whately. She was born in 1872 and died 1 July 1950. <sup>276</sup> Charles Pease was the Postmaster in East Whately.

Child of Charles and Flora:

Marshall, b. 1894 and has his own entry. (13)

## **JOHN HENRY PEASE 11**

The son of Charles F. (9) and Julia (Perkins) Pease, he was born in Whately 12 Feb. 1863 and died 8 Nov. 1930. <sup>277</sup> He married Emma, daughter of Matthew **FARRELL** of Whately. She was born in 1865 and died 3. Jan. 1907. <sup>278</sup> John and Mary had two children:

**Genevieve Dickinson**, b. 7 April 1891 and d. 5 Feb. 1970. <sup>279</sup> She m. John Ingerson who was b. in 1889 in Vermont and d. in Oct. 1973 in Whately. <sup>280</sup> They had one child, **Janet**, b. in 1918 and d. in 2005.

**Dorothy Porter**, b. 23 March 1895 and d. after 1940 when she was living with her husband, Robert MacKay, in Whately.

### **GEORGE FRED PEASE 12**

The son of Charles F. (9) and Julia (Perkins) Pease, he was born at Whately 8 April 1869 and died of tuberculosis, in Whately, 27 April 1905. <sup>281</sup> He married Katherine Electa, the daughter of Freeman **CRAFTS** (68) of Whately. She was born in 1871 and died 7 June 1968. <sup>282</sup> George and Katherine had no children. Katherine married (2) Morris **POWERS** of Whately.

## **MARSHALL RUFUS PEASE 13**

The son of Charles H., (10) and Flora (**DICKINSON**) Pease, he was born in Whately 14 March 1894 and died in May 1963. <sup>283</sup> He married Marion, daughter of Charles **ROSS** of Whately. She

# MARSHALL ROSS PEASE, Jr. 14

The son of Marshall Rufus and (Marion (Ross) Pease, he was born on 5 Oct. 1920 and died 21 Feb. 2006. <sup>285</sup> Marshall married Nellie Waskiewicz of Hatfield. She was born on 22 Dec. 1919 and died on 11 Dec. 2010. 286

Children of Marshall and Nellie:

Rosemary, b. April 1948 and d. in 2008. She m. Arthur Mongeon.

John, b. July 1954. He m. Jane Gore who was b. in 1951.

### JOSEPH PHELIX

The son of Mitchell and Margaret (Pinet) Phelix, he was born about 1863 in Vermont and died after 1930 when he was living in Deerfield. He married Hannah, daughter of Walter **BARDWELL** (55) of Whately. Both their children were born in Montague. The name was often seen as Felix. Crafts wrote that he purchased a house "in the Straits" but no land records were found under either Felix or Phelix.

#### EDWARD PHELPS

The son of Seward and Elizabeth (Amsden) Phelps, he was born in Northampton before 1800 when he was the child enumerated in the household of his parents. He was old enough to be listed as a soldier in the War of 1812 in Whately but not of age when his mother died on 26 March 1815. <sup>287</sup> Calling himself "of Whately" he sold land in town in 1825, 1826, 1828 and 1829 but was never enumerated as a Head of Household in any census in Massachusetts. He was listed in Whately church records in 1826. Crafts wrote that he was making cider brandy in business with Leonard LOOMIS and Daniel Huntington. In two deeds he called himself "late trader" and in one simply trader. Crafts wrote that Phelps went to Michigan and there are homestead records in the name of Edward Phelps in 1833. In 1850 and 1860 in Ypsilanti there is an enumeration of a man named Edward Phelps from Massachusetts. In one census he was listed as a merchant and in the other a peddlar/pedlar. In 1863 and 1864 a man of the right name is listed in tax records as a peddlar. No census record was found in 1870. In 1872 there is a death record for a man of the right name and right age who died of typhoid fever, 3 Sept, 1872. The spaces for birthplace and parents' names are recorded as unknown. 288

### **MOSES PHILBRICK**

The son of Stephen and Lydia (Stevens) Philbrick, he was born in Vermont on 14 April 1814. Moses died on 3 May 1879, the cause recorded as "voilent death". An extensive search revealed nothing further. His occupation when he died was "pauper". He married Abigail Brainard who was born in 1818 and died of "lung congestion" in South Hadley in 1869. <sup>289</sup>. The family is largely associated with South Hadley, but they were in Whately in 1850 and one daughter was born in town. Moses appears in the 1860 census twice. On 1 June he was enumerated as an inmate in the Massachusetts State prison in Charlestown for the crime of larceny. On 28 June he was enumerated as head of household with his family in South Hadley. It is possible that he was released between the two dates or that Abigail lied to the census taker. The family problems may account for the fact that in 1860 the two youngest girls were living several houses away from the others in the family. Abigail and the older children were on page 49 of the census and the younger girls were on page 52. The couple had seven children.

George Spencer, b. 25 July 1838 and d. 13 Nov. 1921. <sup>290</sup>
Halsey Brainard, b. 14 Aug. 1843 and d. in 1921. <sup>291</sup>
Caroline, b. 10 Aug.1845 and d. of scarlet fever, 19 Dec. 1857 in South Hadley. <sup>292</sup>
Sarah, b. 3 Sept. 1949. Her Whately birth record is in the name Elvira M.
Luella, b. 14 March 1854 in South Hadley.
Unnamed male, b. 9 Oct. 1855 in South Hadley. No further records found.
Abbie Lucy, b. 10 June 1857 and d. 22 Feb. 1920 in Florida.

#### RICHARD PHILLIPS

The son of James and Catherine (Daniels) Phillips, he was born in Ireland about 1833 and died in Hatfield 8 May 1904, of apoplexy. <sup>293</sup> He married in Holyoke in 1859, Margaret Connery, also born in Ireland. They had fifteen children. Their children had an astonishingly high mortality rate. In 1900 Richard and Margaret were living in Whately and none of their children were in the household. She reported having had 15 children, eight of whom were alive.

James, b. 14 June 1860 and d. of cholera infantum, 14 Aug. 1860. 294

**Mary**, b. about 1861 and is supposed to have d. in Greenfield.in 1955. She m. John Buckley of Hatfield.

**Walter**, b. 20 Jan. 1863 and d. in July 1863 of diarrhea. <sup>295</sup>

Catherine, b. 28 June 1864 and d. in 1920. <sup>296</sup> She m. William J. Breor of Hatfield.

**Simon**, b. 4 Feb. 1866 and d. of quinsy, 8 Sept. 1866. <sup>297</sup>

Richard, b. about May 1867 and d. of cholera infantum, 24 Sept. 1867. <sup>298</sup>

**Helen**, b. about 1868 and with the family in 1880, called "Nellie". In 1904, in Southwick she m. as his second wife, Arthur Rogers. <sup>299</sup> Her husband died in 1915 and in 1920 she was living in Easthampton with her children.

**Margaret**, b. 21 Dec. 1869. <sup>300</sup> She was 10 years old and with the family in 1880 but no further records found.

**Julia**, b. 16 Feb. 1872 and d. 12 Aug. 1872 of cholera infantum. <sup>301</sup> There is also a death record in Northampton with the same date and cause of death and with parents named. <sup>302</sup>

There is also a death record in Whately with the same date and cause of death for a child named Irene Phillips, but this appears to be an incorrect reading from a damaged record page. <sup>303</sup>.

**Sarah**, born 5 Aug. 1873 and died 27 June 1951. <sup>304</sup> She m. John Leary and lived in Connecticut. **Elizabeth**, b. 28 Dec. 1874 and d. 29 Aug. 1938. <sup>305</sup> She m. Lawrence Barry.

**Michael** b. 18 Jan. 1876 and d. in 1952. 306 He m. Margaret Pegan from Brooklyn, Connecticut. **Alice**, b. 14 March 1877 and d. of "hooping cough", 24 July 1877. 307

**George**, b. 18 July 1878. He was one year old and with the family in 1880 but no further records found. It can be presumed that he lived to adulthood because his mother reported seven children dead by 1900 and he is not one of the seven.

**Anne**, b. 3 Aug. 1880 and d. of "shock from burns", 24 Feb. 1885. 308

Crafts also lists an Elizabeth b. 28 Dec. 1884 but this is an error for the Elizabeth b. on that date in 1874.

## **ERASTUS POTTER 2**

The son of Jonathan and an unknown mother, he was born about 1805 in Montague and died 15 Feb. 1884. <sup>309</sup> He married (1) Matilda, daughter of Daniel **ROGERS** of Whately. She was born 21 May 1806 and died of phthisis, 28 Dec. 1881 in the "State Lunatic Hospital" in Northampton. <sup>310</sup> It is interesting to note that the death record originally read "State Lunatic Asylum" but the word asylum was crossed out and over written with "hospital". Matilda was with her family in 1860, noted as being "insane – cause unknown". She was not found in 1870 but was in Northampton by 1880. Erastus married (2) Mercy Martindale. His four sons were all born to his first wife.

**Edward**, b. 1837 and has his own entry (3)

**Josiah Hayden**, born 1840 and has his own entry (4)

**Orrin Munyan**, b. 1842 and d. at Baton Rouge, Louisiana on 9 March 1863. <sup>311</sup> He was a member of Company I. 52<sup>nd</sup> Massachusetts Infantry. <sup>312</sup>

**Charles**, b. 1845 and committed suicide by hanging, body discovered on 16 Sept. 1923. <sup>313</sup> In 1875 he married Christie Mahogany who was born in Nova Scotia and died of heart disease in Keene, New Hampshire in 1894.

## **EDWARD C. POTTER 3**

The son of Erastus and Matilda (**ROGERS**) Potter, he was born in Whately on 29 Oct. 1837 and died of pneumonia, in Deerfield, 18 Nov. 1897. <sup>314</sup> This date is different from that given by Crafts but supported by the death record and the probate record. <sup>315</sup> The probate record lists three children, one more than included in Crafts. He married (1) Eliza Longley. She was born in 1826 in Hawley and died of consumption, in Northampton, 12 Nov. 1868. Erastus married (2) Margaret Stacey who was born in 1838 in Belchertown and died, also of consumption, in Northampton, 20 March 1877. <sup>316</sup> Her death record is in the name of Mary M. Potter. Erastus married (3) Angeline Bartlett Keyes who was born in New Hampshire in 1837 and died of cancer, in Deerfield, 30 May 1896, just a few months after the marriage. <sup>317</sup> Crafts wrote that he was a Civil War soldier, but no supporting records were found.

### Children of Edward and Eliza:

**Nettie**, b. 1858. She was with her father and stepmother in 1870 but no other records found. **Clara M.**, b. 2 June 1867 and died after 1910 when she was widowed and living in Westfield. She m. Willis Easton. This daughter was omitted in Crafts but was named in her father's probate record. <sup>318</sup>

### Children of Edward and Margaret:

**Louie Miron**, b. Dec. 1870. As "Louis N." he is with his widowed father and his younger brother in 1880, in Whately and he is named in the probate record in 1897. He was a farm laborer living with Almira Jewett in 1900.

**George Barton**, b. 7 Jan. 1875 and d. after 1910 when he was living in South Hadley with his wife and two small children. He m. Ida Sudsbury of South Hadley. Margaret is called "Maria" in the birth record for George.

#### JOSIAH HAYDEN POTTER 4

The son of Erastus and Matilda (**ROGERS**) Potter, he was born at Whately on 4 June 1840 and was "killed on Conn. River R.R. by express train", 30 May 1893. <sup>319</sup> He was 53 years old. He was a Civil War soldier who enlisted in Company I, 52<sup>nd</sup> Massachusetts Infantry. <sup>320</sup>. He married

Elizabeth Socke who was born in Ontario in 1842 and died in Florence in 1931. <sup>321</sup> Their three children were born in Hatfield and Florence and had no Whately connections.

### **CHARLES POTTER**

The son of Charles and Christie (Mahogany) Potter, he was born in Johnstown, New York 2 Jan. 1838 and died of pneumonia, 15 Jan. 1900 in Hatfield. 322 He married Frances, daughter of Lyman **WRISLEY** of Whately. She was born 2 March 1832 and died of paralysis, 26 May 1913. 323 In 1871 Charles was on a list of Whately residents who kept a dog. Charles and Frances had two children:

**Nellie**, b. 25 May 1866 and d. of cholera infantum, 18 Aug. 1866. <sup>324</sup> **John Lyman**. b. 8 March 1868 and d. 3 Aug. 1936 in Mendocino, California. <sup>325</sup> He m. Connie Wenzel.

#### **JAMES POWERS**

The son of William and Mary (mnu) Powers, he was born in Ireland about 1788 and died in Northampton 13 Nov. 1869 of old age. <sup>326</sup> His wife in Massachusetts census records in 1860 was called Mary and in 1865, Nora, but no other records were found. She was alive at the time of James' death. The death record of Mary (Powers) Heafey gives the name of her mother as Honora Kearn. The death record of Nancy (Powers) Powers give the name of her mother as Honora Curren, a variation of the same name. The dates of the children of James and his wife are based on age at death and are approximate.

**Nancy**, b. about 1837 in Ireland and d. of "Pleuro Pneumonia", 1 Oct. 1891 in Northampton. <sup>327</sup> She m. William **POWERS** of Whately.

**Mary**, b. about 1847 in Ireland and d. of consumption, in Whately, 14 Oct. 1875. <sup>328</sup> She m. Nicholas **HEAFEY** of Whately. There is also a death record in Northampton. <sup>329</sup> **Michael**, b. about 1848 in Ireland and d. of consumption, in Buckland, 20 Jan. 1876. <sup>330</sup> He m. Ellen Cortelle of North Adams.

Morris, b. about 1850 in Ireland and has his own entry.

### **BRIDGET POWERS**

Born about 1830 in Ireland, she was the widow of Thomas. She was in Whately by 1865 living with her brother James and her three sons, James, Thomas and Michael and again in 1870 again with her brother and sons. By 1880 the three sons were gone, and she and James were alone. James died in 1892. Bridget appears with her son James in Whately in 1900. Bridget died in Northampton in 1904. <sup>331</sup> James Powers died at the Northampton State hospital on 22 Dec. 1913. <sup>332</sup> His death occurred when he choked on a piece of food. He was 65 years old.

### **WILLIAM POWERS**

This family was not included in Crafts, but they lived in Whately for many years. William was born in County Tipperary Ireland on 1 July 1836, <sup>333</sup> and died in Northampton in 1912. <sup>334</sup>. He was 20 years old, a hired man in Whately in 1855. Br 1860 he was married. His wife was Nancy, daughter of James **POWERS** of Whately. Nancy was born in 1837 and died of "pleuro pneumonia", 21 Oct. 1891. <sup>335</sup> William and Nancy had eight children:

**David**, b. 1858 and d. of "congestion of lungs", in Northampton, 24 March 1876. <sup>336</sup> He did not marry.

**John**, b. 9 March 1861 <sup>337</sup> and d. in 1929. <sup>338</sup> Not known to have married.

**Catherine**, b. 24 March 1863 <sup>339</sup> and d. of "pulmonary tuberculosis", in Springfield, 10 Aug. 1915. <sup>340</sup> She was a widow when she d. and is buried with her family as Catherine Powers. <sup>341</sup> She married Albert Allen.

**Ann**, b. 22 May  $1866^{342}$  and d. in 1957.  $^{343}$  She m. Lawrence Kennedy and is buried with him as "Nano Kennedy".

**Edward**, b. in 1869 and d. in 1935. 344 He did not marry.

Mary, b. 1871 and d. of phthisis, 30 Nov. 1893. 345

**James**, b. 15 May 1874 <sup>346</sup> and d. in 1943. <sup>347</sup> Not known to have married.

**Margaret**, b. 8 May 1877 <sup>348</sup> and d. in 1951. <sup>349</sup>

### **MORRIS J. POWERS**

The son of James and Honora (Curren) Powers, he was born about 1848 in Ireland and died of enteritis, 22 July 1915. <sup>350</sup> He left a will probated in that year. <sup>351</sup> He married (1) Mary, daughter of Morris **NOLAN** in 1870 in Holyoke. (At the time 0of writing, Holyoke is incorrectly indexed as Holbrook on Ancestry). She died of consumption on 1 June 1874 and in 1879 he married (2) Margaret, daughter of Patrick **MORRISSEY** of Whately. Margaret died of meningitis on 21 June 1910. <sup>352</sup>

### Child of Morris and Mary:

**Mary**, b. 16 Jan. 1874, the year her mother died. Mary d. of pneumonia, in Whately, on 17 September 1874. 353

**James**, b. 22 Sept. 1880 in Whately and d. 29 Nov. 1973 in Greenfield. <sup>354</sup> He m. Gertrude Slattery. She was born in Connecticut and may have been related to the Slattery family in Whately.

**Morris Edward**, b. 26 Oct 1882 and d. 11 Jan. 1947. <sup>355</sup> As a single man in 1920 he boarded with Katherine Pease, a widow but by 1930 they were enumerated as married. No marriage record was recorded in Whately. She was the widow of George **PEASE** (12) of Whately and daughter of Freeman **CRAFTS** (68) of Whately.

**Ellen/Nellie**, b. 6 Sept.1884 and with her parents in 1910 but no further records found. Called "Ellen M." in her father's will, so alive in 1915. .

**Edward Michael**, b. 4 May 1887. In 1942 he registered for the draft and listed Mrs. Josephine Powers as his contact. <sup>356</sup>

**Margaret Jennie**, b. 10 July 1889 and d. at an unknown date. She was Margaret age 11 with her parents in 1900 and Jennie, age 20, still with them in 1910 but no further records found.

**Nancy Agnes**, b. 21 Sept. 1894 and d. at an unknown date. Like her sisters she was with her parents in 1900 and 1910 but no further records found.

**Grace May,** b. 6 April 1902 and d. at an unknown date. She was with her parents in both 1900 and 1910, age 8 and 17 respectively but no further records found.

### **KESTER POWLING 1**

The son of William and Eliza (mnu) Powling, he was born about 1844 in Ireland. He was married in Ireland but must have been widowed as he traveled to the United States in 1871 with his parents and two children but no wife. They sailed on *The City of New York and* arrived on 14 Nov. 1871. He was a tailor. He married Harriet/Hattie Bardwell on 15 Jan. 1874; the marriage recorded as his second. She was the daughter of George W. **BARDWELL (57).** By 1880 Kester was widowed and living in Newburgh, New York and his two children were living with Harriet's mother, Risphia (Miller) (Bardwell) **BELDEN (30).** 

# **HORATIO POWLING 2**

The son of William and brother of Kester, he was born in Ireland, on 5 Feb. 1848 and died of pneumonia and measles, in Deerfield, 26 Jan 1902. <sup>357</sup> His son Worthy died nine days later of measles. Worthy was one day old. His daughter Minnie died ten days later of pneumonia. She was born 7 Aug. 1900, and died not yet two years old. Horatio married (1) Adaline the daughter of Herman (sometimes seen as Heman) **BELDEN (39)** of Whately. She died on 4 August 1888.

**George**, b. 19 Dec. 1892 and d. of respiratory failure at the Brattleboro Retreat, 28 March 1982.

364 He m. Mildred Baxter of Halifax, Vermont.

**Ethel**, b. July 1895 and d. in Dec. 1978. <sup>365</sup>

**Robert**, born 1897 and has his own entry. (3)

Eliza, b. 7 April 1899 and d. 15 March 1988. <sup>366</sup> She m. Harry Pierce.

### **HORATIO POWLING 3**

The son of Horatio and Adeline (**BELDEN**) Powling, he was born in Deerfield, 18 June 1884 and died in Whately on 22 Feb. 1971. <sup>367</sup> He married Cora, daughter of Frank O. **SCOTT** (**35**) of Whately. She was born on 21 Jan. 1891 and died on 13 April 1972. <sup>368</sup> The family was in Whately in 1920 but in Wendell by 1930. They had nine children, the first five born in Whately

**Merrill Orrin**, b. 22 Feb. 1912 and d. 15 Dec. 2000. <sup>369</sup> He was not married as of 1940.

Lewis Elmer, b. 22 May 1913 and d. 25 July 1961. <sup>370</sup> He m. Audrey Farmer.

**Grace**, b. 11 Sept. 1915 and d. 20 March 2013. <sup>371</sup> She m. Leon Bezio.

**Doris Fidelia**, b. 13 April 1917 and d. 27 July 2010. <sup>372</sup> She m. William Sandman.

Lena Mae, b. 31 March 1919 and d. 17 Jan. 2007. <sup>373</sup> She m. Robert Southworth.

Arthur Lewis. **Richard**, b. 28 March 1930 and d. 14 June 1982. <sup>377</sup> His wife is not known.

# **ROBERT POWLING 4**

Note that the information about Robert in an earlier Whately history is not correct. The son of Horatio and Lillian (Baker) Powling, he was a half brother of Horatio. He was born in Deerfield on 20 July 1897 and died in Westfield in 1968. <sup>378</sup> He married Ella, daughter of Frank O. **SCOTT (35)** of Whately. She and Cora Scott were sisters. They had seven children:

**Roger Robert**, b. 19 June 1915 <sup>379</sup> and d. in 1970. <sup>380</sup> For reasons unknown he was adopted by Ella's sister Martha (**SCOTT**) **MOREY** and his name was changed to Roger Morey. **Leslie Scott**, b. 1918 and d. at an unknown date. He was with his parents in 1920 but not with them in 1930. An undocumented internet source has muddled him with his brother Robert Leslie

Francis Worthy, b. 13 July 1919 and d. 3 Dec. 1991. 381

Gladys Adeline, b. 17 Sept. 1921 and d. 29 July 2000. 382 She m. Roger Danio.

**Leon**, b. 1924 and killed in action, Germany, 28 Oct. 1945. There is a stone in the Henri-Chapelle Cemetery in Belgium <sup>383</sup> and another, probably a cenotaph, in South Hadley. <sup>384</sup> There is a nice informal picture of Leon on his Find a Grave site.

**Herbert**, b. about 1927 and d. 7 July 1973. 385

**Robert**, b. 15 March 1928 and d. 7 July 1999. 386

Gertrude, b. 1930 no further records found. She was with her parents in 1930.

## **AARON PRATT**

Scott.

The son of Aaron he was born in East Hartford, Connecticut in 1759 and died 9 Feb. 1813. <sup>387</sup> He was a Revolutionary War soldier. In 1871 he married (1) Rachael, daughter of Benjamin **SMITH** (5) of Whately. She died 8 March 1893 and the words "died in child bed" are engraved on her stone. <sup>388</sup> In 1794 he married (2) Jerusha, daughter of Jonathan **SMITH** (10), the first cousin of his first wife. She was born on 6 Oct. 1771 and died 26 Jan 1842. <sup>389</sup> He had children with both of his wives, only two of them recorded by Crafts.

**Caroline**, b. 1783 and d. at an unknown time and place. Crafts wrote that she m. Solomon Hubbard, but no supporting records were found.

**Linus**, b. 1786 and d. 24 Jan. 1847. <sup>390</sup>

Unnamed son, b. 1788, no supporting records found.

**Rachel**, b. 1790, no supporting records found.

Samuel, b. 1791, no supporting records found.

Children of Aaron and Jerusha:

Jonathan, b. 1794 and d. 1850. <sup>391</sup> He m. Clarissa Jennings.

**Almond**, b. 1795 and d. 27 May 1849. <sup>392</sup> Grave record says he was born in Rhode Island.

**Alva**, b. 1796 and d. 29 July 1873. <sup>393</sup> Grave record is as Alvan. He m. Anna Peck.

Emmeline, b. 1808 in Williamson, New York.

**Jerusha**, b. 9 May 1810 and d. 11 Nov. 1852. <sup>394</sup> She m. John Wilberforce Sherman.

Mary, b. May 1813 and d. 10 April 1848. 395

### **CAPT. AMOS PRATT**

Amos Pratt was neither born nor died in Whately. He married in 1803 Mary, daughter of Isaiah **BROWN** (5) of Whately. She died very soon after the marriage and there were no living children.

### JOSEPH PRINCE

Probably the son of Thomas and Margaret (mnu) Prince, baptized 13 November 1803 at Ardwick Chapel in Manchester, England. He married Anna Clark, born in Boston about <sup>396</sup> 1808. They were in Whately in 1850 and 1860 where Joseph worked as a spinner in a yarn factory. By 1870 they were in Salisbury, Connecticut. Joseph died 17 June 1891 in Connecticut. <sup>397</sup> They had four children, only one born in Whately. A one-year-old girl, enumerated as "Carra" was with them in 1870, possibly a grandchild. Ann would have been about 60, beyond childbearing age.

**Thomas,** b. 1 April 1846 at an unknown place in Massachusetts and d. 10 July 1916 at the Soldier's Home in Washington D.C. <sup>398</sup>

**Joseph Benjamin,** b. 11 Oct. 1848 in Shelburne Falls according to his death record. He was an employee of the railroad and died of internal injuries incurred in a railroad accident 0n 15 oct. 1913. <sup>399</sup>

**Sarah,** b. 10 Nov. 1849 in Whately. She m. (1) George Stone and (2) John Louis Lowell. She d. of diabetes, in Pittsfield on 19 Aug. 1911. 400 401

**John Musgrave**, b. 29 June 1851 in Northampton and d. at an unknown time and place.

## **GEORGE PRUTT**

Called "a pious old slave" <sup>402</sup> Prutt was the son of Arthur and Joan Prutt, a family owned by Rev. Isaac Chauncey of Hadley. The Prutt children were divided among the Chauncey children as they grew up and Richard Chauncey and his wife Elizabeth brought George with them when they came to live with their daughter Abigail and her husband, Jonathan **SMITH** (10) in Whately. George and Elizabeth Chauncey were founding members of the Whately Church when it was organized in 1771. George died of "putrid fever" on 18 Sept. 1794, <sup>403</sup> outliving Richard Chauncey by four years. His death record is in Whately, and it is presumed that he lived those four years with Jonathan, by then a widower.

## **EDMUND QUINN**

The son of William and Margaret (Harney) Quinn, he was born. 1839 in Ireland and died. of pneumonia, 21 Dec. 1887. 404 (His gravestone says 22 Dec. 405 and Crafts wrote Dec. 23). In 1881 Edmund brought a charge of assault against Joseph Ditte. 406 The document makes clear that Quinn fought back and did "beat bruise and ill treat" Ditte. The witnesses named were Michael **HANDRAHAN** and William and John Quinn, sons of Edmund. The court ruled that Ditte was not guilty. Ditte is not included in Crafts and no land or other records were found to place him in Whately. Edmund died intestate and there is a probate record including a list of nine children aged 21 and younger, as of 25 March 1889. 407 Exact days of birth for the children were given in the probate record. Edmund married Mary (Donovan according to Crafts) Haley in the annotation of her stone. 408 She was born in 1845 in Ireland and died 8 Dec. 1920. 409 Edmund and Mary had eleven children:

**William**, b. 1865 and d. of carcinoma of the bladder, in Northampton, 25 March 1909. <sup>410</sup> William was not included in the list of children supplied by Crafts, but he is with the family in 1880 and is supported by the records. He m. Mary Kelly of Vermont.

**Margaret**, b. 1866. She was 14 years old and with the family in 1880 but nothing further found. She was not named in the probate record but would have been older than 21 when her father d. in 1909 and not included in the list of minors.

**John**, b. 28 July 1868 and d. in Williamsburg, 4 Sept. 1911 of meningitis. <sup>411</sup> He m. Elizabeth Riley.

**James**, b. 11 Jan. 1870 and d. after 1930 when he was single, a boarder, and living in East Whately.

**Joseph**, b. 27 Nov. 1872 and d. after 1920 when he was living with his brothers James and Edward in Whately.

**Mary Ann**, b. 27 Dec. 1873 and d. 30 June 1959 in Greenfield. She m. Benjamin Cohan. <sup>412</sup> In 1910 they were living with her widowed mother

**Edward**, b. 1 Jan. 1876 and d. after 1920 when he was living with his brother James and Joseph in Whately.

Ellen, b. 28 Aug. 1880 and d. in 1927. 413 She m. James F. Supple of Deerfield.

Kate, b. 3 Sept. 1882 and d. in 1948. 414 She m. Edward MORRISSEY of Whately.

**Anna**, b. 1 June 1884 and d. in 1944. 415 She m. William Boyle of Hatfield.

**Stephen**, a posthumous child b. 1 or 2 March 1888 <sup>416</sup> and d. after 1942 when he registered for the draft. <sup>417</sup> He listed Paul Duda as his contact so was apparently not married. He was not included in Crafts' list of children but was named in the probate record and is found in other records as well.

#### **SIMEON REED 6**

The son of Benjamin and Abiah (Macomber) Reed, he was born in 1789 and died of dysentery, in Whately, 28 Aug. 1853. <sup>418</sup> He died intestate but the probate record includes an inventory. <sup>419</sup> He married Miranda, daughter of Justin **MORTON** (13) of Whately. She was born in 1798 and died of old age, in Hatfield, 19 March 1873. <sup>420</sup> Simeon and Miranda had six children:

**Jeanette**, b. 1815 and d. of diarrhea and old age, in Hatfield, 14 Sept. 1899. <sup>421</sup> She m. Alvin Sanderson of Hatfield.

Mary, b. 1817 and d. of dysentery, in Hatfield, 27 Sept. 1893. 422 She m. Stephen Curtis of Hatfield

**Benjamin Franklin**, b. 1819 and has his own entry (7)

**George Washington**, b. 1825 and has his own entry (8)

**Elizabeth**, b. 1826 and d. after 1870 when she was living in Pontiac, Illinois with her husband. She m. Rufus Babcock.

**Martha**, b. 1829 and d. after 1870 at which time she was living next door to her sister, Elizabeth Reed Babcock.

### **BENJAMIN FRANKLIN REED 7**

The son of Simeon (7) and Miranda (**MORTON**) Reed, he was born in Whately 5 Oct. 1819 and died at an unknown date after 1880 when he was living with his presumed second wife, Charlotte Reed in Hammonton, New Jersey. He married (1) Sarah, daughter of Deacon David **SAUNDERS** of Whately. The marriage failed sometime after 1860 when they were living in Whately with two children, Jane and Albert. By 1865 Sarah was living with her mother, Amy Saunders in Northampton. She was born 6 April 1823 and died on 13 Feb. 1919. 423

**Jane Caroline**, b. 12 Feb. 1846 and d. 24 Feb. 1936. <sup>424</sup> She m. David Joy Wright in 1879 in Northampton.

**Lucy Ann**, b. 5 Feb. 1848. She was not enumerated with her parents in 1850 or 1860. On 25 May 1870, in Northampton, as "Lucy A. R. Sanders", she m. John Lawrence. <sup>425</sup> Her parents were listed in the marriage record.

**Mary Wheeler**, b. 17 Sept. 1850 and d. of scarlet fever, 3 Nov. 1852. <sup>426</sup> She is buried in the High Street Cemetery in Haydenville.

**Albert**, b. 1852 and has his own entry (10)

#### **GEORGE WASHINGTON REED 8**

The son of Simeon (7) and Miranda (**MORTON**) Reed, he was born in Whately 23 Feb. 1825 and died of apoplexy, 28 Dec. 1906. <sup>427</sup> He married Helen, the daughter of Jabez **PEASE** of Whately. On 2 Nov. 1847 the day before their marriage, they signed a prenuptial agreement. Helen, although only age 20, was guaranteed rights to her personal estate, "free from the control and interference of her husband". That estate included a mahogany sofa, a Pembroke cherry table, a wool house carpet, window shades, kitchen ware, looking glasses, an airtight stove, silver spoons and other items. <sup>428</sup> They were divorced by 1880 and she, working as a dressmaker, was living alone in Whately. Helen was born in 1827 and died after 1920 when she was 92 years old and living with her daughter in Worcester. George and Helen had four children:

**George LaForrest**, b. 17 Sept. 1848 and d. of scarlet fever, 21 Feb. 1854.  $^{429}$  The gravestone is inscribed "Georgie."  $^{430}$ 

**Merrill Pease**, b. 1854 and has his own entry (9)

**Helen Marion**, b. 1857 and d. after 1920 when she was living with her husband in Worcester. She married Frank Justin **WAITE** (**78**) of Whately. She was called "Marion H. in both the 1910 and 1920 census records and her widowed mother was living with her in those years. **Curtis Babcock**, b. Oct. 1865 and d. 9 March, 1866 of "congestion of the lungs", age five months. <sup>431</sup>

### **MERRILL PEASE REED 9**

The son of George (8) and Helen (**PEASE**) Reed, he was born in Whately 4 Sept. 1854 and died. 31 May 1940 in Los Angeles. <sup>432</sup> He married (1) Lillian Miner of Greenfield. She died on 3 Sept.

1885, two days after giving birth <sup>433</sup> The baby boy who was unnamed in the death record, died four days later on 7 Sept. <sup>434</sup> His burial record names him Gilbert and dates his death as 6 Sept. <sup>435</sup> Merrill married (2) Margaret McCormick. Merrill and Margaret lived and had their family in California.

### **ALBERT DAVID REED 10**

The son of Benjamin Franklin (7) and Sarah (**SAUNDERS**) Reed, he was born at Whately on 17 Oct. 1852 and died in Peterborough, New Hampshire, two days before his 95<sup>th</sup> birthday on 15 Oct. 1947. <sup>436</sup> By the time he was 18, he had changed his surname from Reed to Sanders, the maiden name of his mother. He married Rebecca Strong of Northampton. She was born in 1854 and died in 1935 in Easthampton. <sup>437</sup> Although Crafts wrote that he moved to Colorado this does not appear to be the case. In 1900 and 1910 they were in Illinois but by 1920 were in Easthampton. They had children but none with Whately connections. There are some good photographs with the Find a Grave record.

### **LUTHER REED**

The son of Dwight and Margaret (Haskins) Reed he was unrelated to the other Whately Reeds. He was born 1 Sept. 1857 in Shutesbury and died in 1916. <sup>438</sup> He married Hattie Belle, daughter of Leander **CRAFTS** (69). She was born in 1866 and died in 1944. <sup>439</sup> Their children were born in Springfield.

### **HIRAM ROBINSON**

The son of Joseph and Submit (Potter) Robinson, he was born in Barre, Massachusetts 8 June 1801 and died 12 April 1891 in Drakesburg, Ohio. The Find a Grave annotation is extensive and corrects errors in the ancestry published by Crafts. Hiram married Sophia, daughter of Moses **GRAVES** (31) of Whately. She was born in 1802 and died 20 Jan. 1882. She is buried in Drakesburg with her husband. Their first three children were born in Ware and the last three in Whately.

**Martha A.** b. 1830 and d. 25 July 1910, at Cortland, Ohio. <sup>442</sup> She m., as his second wife, Oliver Burrows.

**Parthenia**, b. 1832 and d. 7 Aug. 1907. <sup>443</sup> In 1872 when she was 40 years old she m. the Rev. Isaac Winans, a man 33 years her senior.

Hiram, b. 1834 and d. in Ohio before 1910. 444 He m. Hattie Peters of Ohio.

**Eliza**, b. 1838 in Whately and d. after 1930 when she was living in Ohio. She is buried in Ohio but there is no picture of the stone, and her death date is not recorded. <sup>445</sup> She m. George Wheelock.

Sophia, b. 1840 in Whately and d. 30 Aug. 1932. 446 She m. James Kellogg.

**George**, b. 1846 and d. in Cortland, Ohio, 29 Oct. 1911 of chronic cystitis. 447 He m. Maggie Irving.

#### GEORGE ROGERS

The son of Benjamin and Phoebe (Harding) Rogers, he was born in 1739 and died. 29 Oct. 1823. <sup>448</sup> He married Ann Brewster and all of his children were born in New London, Connecticut before they came to Whately about 1779. Both appear to be descendants of Mayflower passengers. They are buried in the West Whately Cemetery. Ann died on 21 Feb, 1824, just a few months after her husband. <sup>449</sup> The list of children comes from the will written by George on 36 Dec. 1816, <sup>450</sup> about 8 years before he died.

**Ebenezer George**, named in his father's will and given \$1.00. Not named in Crafts. **Benjamin**, b. 1759 and d. after 1816 when he was named in his father's will and left the sum of \$1.00. He m. Mary/Polly, daughter of Jonathan **EDSON** of Whately.

**Anna**, b. about 1785 and d. of heart disease, in Hawley, 3 Feb. 1868. <sup>451</sup> She m. John **STARKS** of Whately. She was named in her father's will and given his household furniture, to become hers after the death of her mother.

**Daniel**, b. about 1779 and has his own entry.

Nathan Caswell, named in his father's will and given \$1.00. Not named in Crafts.

Elisha Mir?, named in his father's will and given \$1.00. Not named in Crafts.

### **DANIEL ROGERS**

The son of George and Ann (Brewster) Rogers, he was born in Lebanon, Connecticut about 1779 and died 27 June 1857. <sup>452</sup> He inherited the whole of his father's estate to become his after the death of his mother. He married (1) Alinda, daughter of Joseph **HILL** of Whately. She was born in 1780 and died 20 Feb. 1841. <sup>453</sup> Daniel and Alinda had four children, all born in Whately. He married (2) Anna Smith, *nee* Tucker.

**Matilda**, b. 21 May 1806 and d. of phthisis, 28 Dec. 1881, in Whately. <sup>454</sup> She m. Erastus **POTTER** (2) of Whately. In the 1860 census it was noted that she was "insane". She was not found in 1870 but by 1880 she was in the "State Lunatic Hospital" in Northampton and it was there that she died. Erastus remarried and moved to California.

**Philena**, b. 6 May 1809 and d. 27 April 1892. <sup>455</sup> She m. Patrick McStay who was born in Ireland. They married in Brattleboro, Vermont.

**Experience**, b. 1811 and d. of a fractured hip, 9 July 1886, in Whately. <sup>456</sup> She m. William Judd of Northampton.

**Rebecca**, b. 1814 and d. of pneumonia, in Northampton, 3 Feb. 1892. <sup>457</sup> She m. Frederick Moor/e.

### FRED ROOTE

The son of Enoch and Sarah (Utley) Roote, he was born in Westfield in 1844 and died of "erysipelas of head", 16 April 1897. <sup>458</sup> This was just eight days after his daughter Bertha died. of appendicitis, age 26. <sup>459</sup> He married Mary, daughter of Randall **GRAVES** (63) of Whately. She was born in 1849 in Whately and died there on 11 Feb. 1943. <sup>460</sup> Mary married (2) Stephen C. **KINGSLEY**. Fred and Mary had three children:

**Bertha**, b. 3 July 1870 and d. 8 April 1897. <sup>461</sup> She m. Charles **WAITE** (**79**) of Whately. **Herbert Enoch**, b. March 1872 and has his own entry. **Arline Isabel**, b. 12 Aug. 1888 in Whately and d. 16 May 1964. <sup>462</sup> She m. Harvey, son of

Charles **WAITE** (2.4) of Hatfield and Whately.

## HERBERT ENOCH ROOTE

The son of Fred and Mary (**GRAVES**) Roote, he was born on 26 March 1872 and died. 17 Oct. 1936. <sup>463</sup> In 1900 he was a clerk in the Whately store operated by Micajah Howes and boarded with the Howes. In 1930 he was an inmate at the Northampton State Hospital. He m. Ellen Maybelle Raftery of Hopkinton. They had no children.

#### EDWARD RUDDOCK

Edward was the son of Edward and Esther (Raymond) Ruddock. He was born 24 Feb. 1766 in England and died at Pitcher, New York, 4 April 1855. His father died en route to Massachusetts and his mother married (2) Jonathan Spofford whose first wife was Ruth, daughter of Joseph Sanderson (4). Edward married Martha, daughter of Thomas **SANDERSON** (6) of Whately. She was born on 10 Feb. 1772 and died 13 Feb, 1861, three days after her 89<sup>th</sup> birthday. <sup>464</sup> Crafts wrote that Edward and Martha had 14 children but did not give details. The following eight were found.

**Justus**, b. 1788 and is supposed to have d. in 1856 in Berlin, Wisconsin. He was living there in 1850. He m. Rhoda Demman.

Edward, b. 1793 and d. 16 July 1881, of old age, in Deerfield. 465

Asa, b. 15 Sept. 1798 in Whately and d. 21 June 1875 in Buckland. 466

**Samuel**, b. 1801 in Whately and d. 19 Nov. 1880 in Pitcher, New York. <sup>467</sup> He m. (1) Hannah Eames and (2) Esther Shipman.

**Esther**, b. about 1803 (age 59 at time of death) and d. 31 March 1862. <sup>468</sup> She m. Jeremiah Morgan.

**Alvin**, b. Sept. 1804 in Whately and d. 9 Aug. 1895 in Buckland. <sup>469</sup> His son, Alvin Sanderson Ruddock, called "Sanderson Ruddock, m. Dorcas, daughter of Lewis **MORTON** (27) of Whately.

Ruth, b. in 1810 and is supposed to have d. in 1862 in Pitcher, New York. No supporting records found.

Mary Ann, b. 20 Oct. 1816 and d. 21 April 1901. 470 She m. Shelby Terrill.

## **CHARLES RUSSELL**

The son of Daniel and Sally (Newton) Russell he was born in Hadley on 5 April 1799 and died in Bradford County, Pennsylvania on 16 Aug. 1885. 471 He married Cordelia, known as Delia, the daughter of Asa **SMITH** (20) of Whately. She was born in 1799 and died on 25 Feb. 1882. 472 He is supposed to have built a house on the west side of River Road, in the Canterbury area. The house, much changed, burned once and was rebuilt and burned again in 2001. 473 In 1880 both Charles and Delia were living in Pennsylvania with their daughter Eliza Farmer.

George, b. ca 1829 and d. at an unknown date. He m. Mary Ophelia, daughter of Harris WAITE (47) of Whately. They were in Sunderland in 1860. Hatfield in 1870 and Hadley in 1880. They adopted Ada Louise, b. 1860 in Huntington, the illegitimate daughter of Clementine Weeks. In 1880 she was enumerated as Fannie, age 12.

**Edward Justin,** b. 23 Oct. 1833 and d. 16 Dec. 1915. <sup>474</sup> He m. (1) Lucenia Prouty and (2) Jane Louise Prentiss. There are two good pictures with his gravestone record.

**Eliza**, b. 25 Sept. 1836 and d. 11 Oct. 1898. 475 She m. Leonard Farmer.

Harriet, b. 1838, no other records found.

Henry Julius, b. 17 March 1843 in Whately and d. at an unknown date. <sup>476</sup> He m. (1) Julia Maynard (1860 – 1896) and (2) Lucy Biggs (1859 – 1927. Both wives buried with Henry.
